We are always called to have a Knowing, Loving, Serving relationship with **GOD**...

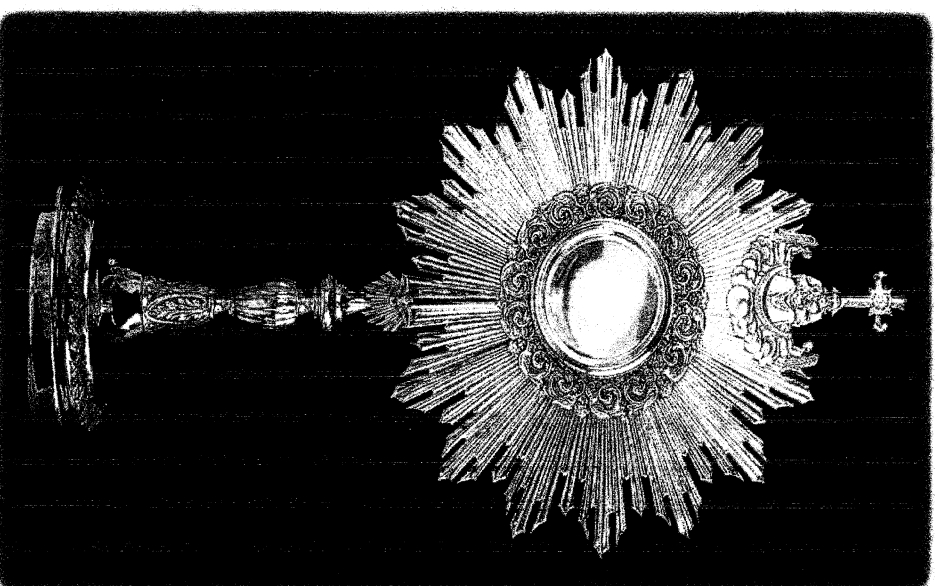
GOD is the giver of time!

What is Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration?

Perpetual Eucharistic Adoration is the adoration of Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist 24 hours a day, everyday of the year. Jesus Christ is present in Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity in the consecrated Host exposed on the altar in the morisrance. Adorers make a promise to Jesus and the community to come each week on a specific day and time to pray and to worship Our Eucharistic Lord and Savior.

Why Join Eucharistic Adoration?

Jesus our Eucharistic Lord, our companion, and our Divine Physician, our Good Shepherd, is made available day and night for anyone to come to Him to pour out one's heart to Him, to ask for inspiration, to be consoled and to be comforted in sorrows and afflictions, to express sorrow for sin, to beg favors, to ask guidance, to seek encouragement, to gain strength, to give thanks, or to be healed of spiritual and physical infirmities.

How does one spend an hour before Jesus in the

Most Blessed Sacrament?

Jesus wants you to spend this hour with Him to adore Him in the most Blessed Sacrament. There are many ways you may do this. You may bring your own devotional prayer books or use some that are in the Chapel library. You can read the Bible, pray the Rosary or just sit and say "Speak Lord your servant is listening." Simply enjoy the sweet peace that comes from just being in His presence in silent dialogue ("Come to Me all you who labor and are burdened, and I will refresh you." Mt. 11: 28-30.) You may think that you can't pray well, but don't be discouraged. Just the fact that you take time out of your life each week to spend an hour with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament pleases Him very much and is in itself a prayer of great faith.
